



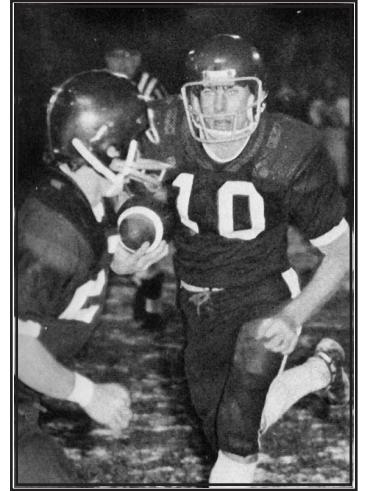
WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2019

JEFF MECKLEY – Jeff Meckley has been an instrumental part of the West York football program since his playing days back in the mid 70's. Meck played 3 years of football for the Blue and White as a Quarterback/Wing Back and Safety. His 11 interceptions in the 1974 season still stands as the most in a season. That '74 season saw Jeff earn All County honors as a safety.

Jeff went on to Indiana University of PA from 1976-1980 where he was 4 year varsity wrestler.

Meck came back to West York and spent 20+ years as the West York Boys Club Midget Football Coach/WYBC Football Commissioner. Serving in these positions helped the Bulldog program to continued success through the 80's, 90's, and early 2000's.

Jeff is married to Marianne and has one son, Zachary as well as 2 grandsons Francis and Bart.



ALAN SILAR – A 1981 graduate, Alan Silar excelled for 3 varsity football seasons in the late 70's and early 80's. Alan was a 2 way player as a running back and defensive back. Most notably on offense, Alan carried the ball 502 times for 2300 yards (4.6 yds/carry) and 27 touchdowns. His 226 rush attempts in 1979 still sets the school mark. His 1136 yards in '79 is the 5th best in school history. He was a 2 time YCIAA Super 22 first team selection as well as a 1980 Midstate Top 100 pick.

After high school, Alan went onto serve in the United States Army from 1982-1986. Now living in Placerville, California, his family includes wife Karen, children Michael, Christina, Lisa, Zachary, and Matthew. Alan also has 5 grandchildren Abigail, Austin, Andrew, Mason, and Van.

Alan is currently the Vice President of Lean Management and Technical Training for Raymond Handling Concepts (Fremont, CA) and Raymond Handling Solutions (Santa Fe Springs, CA).

STEVE SHANABROOK – Graduating in 1996, Steve Shanabrook was a 3 year starter at QB.

In 1994, Steve had a prolific passing year throwing for 1258 yards which at the time was the school record. His 381 passing yards vs York Suburban still sets the school mark as well as his 18 completions in that game. His 221 pass attempts and 103 completions in 1995 rank 2nd in both categories.

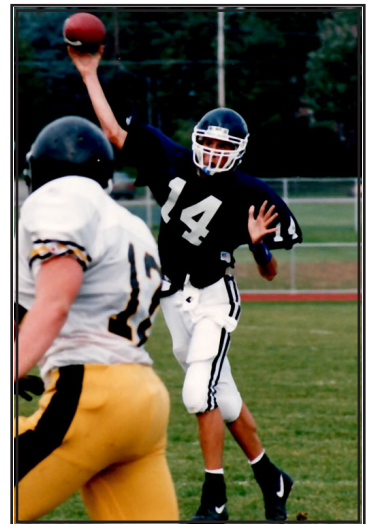
Steve was named a 1st team QB on the 1994 York Dispatch/Coaches Division II team and a 2nd team pick on the York Daily Record "Super 24" team.

In the 1994 district playoffs, Steve set a Class AA record (at the time) for passing yards with 221 vs Juniata.

In 1995, Steve was once again named to the Dispatch/Sunday News Division II team as the first team QB. That senior season also brought a starting QB nod in the War of the Roses All Star game as York defeated Lancaster.

Steve went on to Colgate for one year where he played football before transferring to East Stroudsburg where he played varsity volleyball from 1997-2000.

Steve is currently a Business Consultant with Capgemini Invent - North America. His family members include fiance Lisa, Mom Betsy and Stepdad David.





BLAKE CAMPBELL – An all around player for the Bulldogs, Blake Campbell starred as a Defensive End, Outside Linebacker, Fullback, and Slot Receiver from 2006-2008. Blake was a team captain on the 2008 District III championship team.

Blake recorded 26 career sacks. His 14 sacks in 2007 still sets the school mark while his 8.5 in 2008 ranks 5th.

In his junior year 2007, Blake was named to the YAI AA Division II team as 1st team DE and 2nd team WR. He also was PA All-State 1st team DE in '07. In 2008, Blake once again was named to the YAI AA Division II team as a 2nd team DE.

Upon graduation, Blake attended Villanova University graduating with a degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering. He continued his post graduate studies earning a MBA in finance from Johns Hopkins University.

He is currently a Project Manager at The Whiting Turner Contracting Company. His family members include parents Steve & Karen along with brothers Brett and Ross, both former Bulldog players.

BRANDON REAL – The 2007 & 2008 seasons turned in by Brandon Real were arguably two of the greatest offensive displays in Bulldog history.

The numbers speak for themselves: Season Records -

Most Rushing yards - 1894 (2008) #1, 1237 (2007) # 3

Most Touchdowns - 40 (2008) #1

Most Total Points - 242 (2008) #1, 132 (2007) #5. The 242 points is 97 points ahead of the #2 spot.

Individual Game Records -

Most Rushing Yards - 406 rushing yards vs Conrad-Weiser in the 2008 district quarterfinals is a Class AAA playoff record as well as the top spot in school history. Brandon also holds 3 of the next 4 top spots with 316 vs Kennard-Dale (2008) #2, 290 vs Littlestown (2008) #3, 242 vs Susquehannock (2008) #5

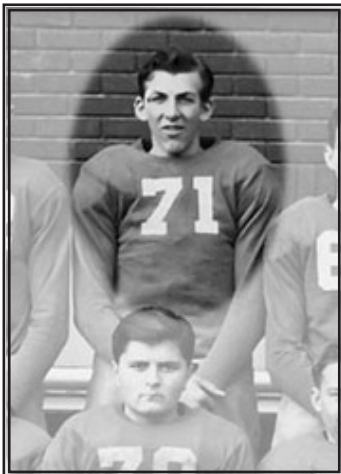
Most Touchdowns - 6 vs Hanover/Northeastern/Susquehannock/Conrad Weiser (2008) T1, 4 vs Dallastown/York Suburban (2008) T4

Most Total Points - 36 vs Hanover/Northeastern/Susquehannock/Conrad Weiser (2008) T1, 26 vs Dallastown (2008) T5.

After graduation, Brandon attended Millersville University.

Brandon would like to thank his Mom and brother Tyler (former Bulldog) for getting him involved in football and keeping after him to pursue his goals. He would also like to thank all his coaches but especially Coach Miller, Coach Munsch, Coach Jones, and Coach Snelbaker for the endless support. Brandon is currently a production supervisor at Harley-Davidson and is pursuing his dream of being a high school coach helping out Coach Miller at Dallastown.



ART "ZENO" LENTZ – The West York Football HOF is proud to posthumously induct Art "Zeno" Lentz. Mr. Lentz was a true Bulldog!!

Art was a 1946 West York graduate excelling in football, basketball, and baseball. That graduation came after serving in the Army during WWII in 1944 and 1945 where he received two Bronze Stars and a Purple Heart.

Basketball became a bigger part of Art's life after high school as he attended and played at York College. He played Eastern Pro League for Victory of York and Pottsville. In 1948 and 1949, Art was the leading scorer in the league and was recruited to play for the Baltimore Bullets of the early NBA. He continued to play in various local basketball and softball leagues until the age of 60.

Art was an avid supporter of all Bulldog sports. Living close to the school, Art would make his way to just about any sporting event he could find. Football and basketball games you could always find him along the fence or on one of the first rows of bleachers cheering on the Bulldogs. Art passed away this past December. He is survived by his wife Ruth, daughter Jane, sons Steven, Michael, Larry and Mark.
