



WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2022

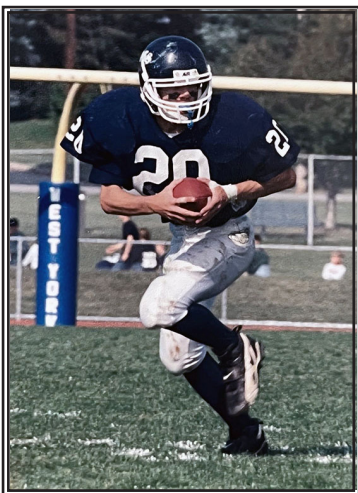
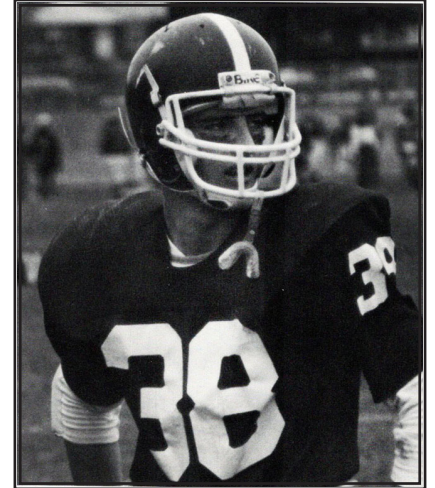
JAY ZECH – Jay Zech played 3 years of varsity football at West York from 1979-1981. He played outside linebacker on defense and wingback and tailback on offense. Defensively, Jay was in the top 4 in tackles both his junior and senior year. On offense, he rushed for over 1000 yards his senior season.

Jay had West York football in his blood watching his middle brother Dave play on the undefeated 19 consecutive win teams in the late 1960's.

After WY, Jay attended Lock Haven University graduating in 1986. He played football in the 1982 and 1983 seasons before a small bone break in his back ended his playing career.

Jay and his wife Penny started Gung Ho Bikes in 1991 in a garage behind a cousin's house in West York. A break in claimed their entire three bike inventory. Staying the course, Jay and Penny decided to "go for it" and get a store front location. They did so moving to the White Street strip mall in West York from 1992-1999 before moving to their current location on the Susquehanna Trail.

Jay has 2 daughters, both WY graduates. Eldest daughter Ashley played volleyball for the Bulldogs while younger daughter Kate was a 3 sport athlete. Both girls have gone on to teaching careers, Ashley in Arizona and Kate right here at WY where she is also a girls soccer assistant coach.



SETH McLANE– Seth McLane played varsity football for the Bulldogs from 1996-1998. He played on two division championship teams and the 1997 District 3 Class AA Silver Medal team. Seth was a halfback on offense, played defensive back ('96 and '98) and outside linebacker ('97), and returned kicks and punts. For his career he scored 25 touchdowns, had 11 interceptions, 5 fumble recoveries, and 121 solo tackles.

In 1997 and 1998, Seth was the York County Division 2 second team running back. On defense, he was the 1997 Division 2 second team linebacker, and in 1998, the first team defensive back. In 1998, he was named to the Super 24 All Star team as a defensive back.

Seth went on to play basketball in college - one year at Gettysburg and three years at York College where he remains in the top ten in career assists and steals. After college, Seth returned to West York to coach basketball alongside Bill Ackerman from 2004-2008. Currently, he is an assistant varsity basketball coach at Dallastown.

Seth is in his 19th year teaching English at Spring Grove Middle School. He lives in Dallastown with his wife Nicky and two children, Chase (14) and Natalie (11).

NICK GLINGAN – A 2009 graduate of West York, Nick was a 3-year Varsity letterman at linebacker and tight-end. He helped the Bulldogs to three Division championships and a District 3 Championship in 2008. His contributions earned him two West York Student Council Sportsmanship awards, the PIAA District III Fackler-Hower Sportsmanship award, and a 2nd team All-York-Adams selection.

Upon graduating, Nick attended Moravian University to study Physics and Computer Science where he continued his football career at the linebacker position. He was a 4-year varsity letterman playing in 28 games and helping the Greyhounds to an ECAC Division 3 Southeast Bowl Championship his sophomore year.

He currently works as a software engineer at Microsoft and resides in Northern Virginia with his wife, Brittany, and their daughter, Danielle.

Nick notes that it is an honor and a privilege to be included in the company of some of West York's greats and credits his growth as a person on and off the field to two instrumental coaches, Karl Munscher and Ron Miller. Stay Frosty.

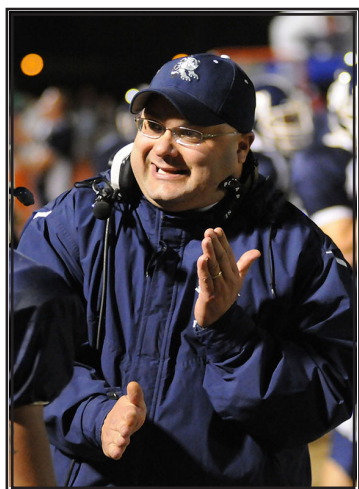


RON MILLER – Ron and his family arrived in West York during the spring of 2006. Taking over for longtime coach (and fellow WY Hall of Famer) Terry Bupp, Ron went on to the following;

86-24 record • 86% winning percentage • 44-4 YAIAA Division 2 record • 92% Division 2 winning percentage • 6 straight YAIAA Division 2 titles, 7 overall • 8 District 3 playoff appearances • District 3 Class AAA title in 2008 • District 3 Class AAA runner up in 2012 • 4 District 3 semifinal appearances ('08, '09, '11, '12) • Named Division 2 Coach of the Year 6 times • PSFCA District 3 Director • Coached 7 Player of the Year recipients • Coached 3 Mini-Maxwell winners • PSFCA East/West Game Assistant Coach 2009 • Coached WY to 10-0 regular season in 2012, the first in 21 years • Had 2 13 win seasons; most in school and York County history • 2012 District 3 Coach of the Year • Member Ed Romance PA Sports Hall of Fame • Member Susquehanna University Sports Hall of Fame • Won 100th game as head coach of the Dallastown Wildcats.
