

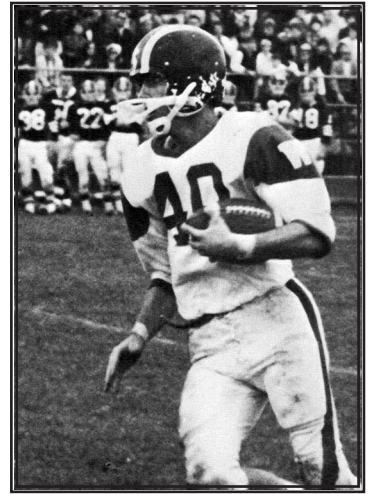


WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2017

Wayne Hoffman – Wayne Hoffman was an integral part of the West York football success in the late 60's. As a running back, defensive back, and kick returner, Wayne was part of the school's first ever undefeated teams in 1967 and 1968 championship seasons. He was the league scoring champ in 1967 (14 TD) and 1968 (24 TD). His 24 rush TD's in 1968 also ranks him 3rd in the WY record books and his 145 total points that season ranks 2nd. He was a member of the All League teams in both '67 and '68 and was voted the West York Outstanding Back in 1968. His 1968 season gained Wayne an Honorable Mention Big 33 nod. In 2000, Wayne was selected as one of the top 40 players in the first 40 years of YAIAA football.

Wayne attended Lock Haven University where he was a 4 year varsity starter for the Bald Eagles as a wide receiver and kick returner. At the time of his college graduation he was ranked in the top 5 in career receptions, receiving yards and kick return yards.

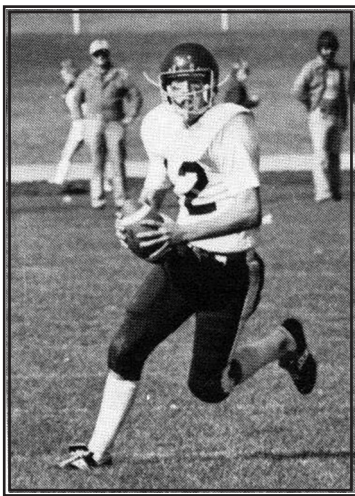
He is currently retired after a 35 year teaching career at Penn Manor and Lampeter-Strasburg. He coached football for 23 years and is currently a PIAA official for the past 18 years. He and his wife Deb have 4 children (Jason, Steve, Jackie & Megan) and 4 grandchildren (Alexandria, Grady, Liam & Owen).



Tim Ebersole – Tim Ebersole was a 3 sport (football, basketball, baseball) 3 year (1976-1978) starter for West York. He was the Bulldogs starting QB for 3 years throwing for over 1000 yards his senior year. His 92 pass completions in 1978 ties him for 4th in the West York record book. His 16 completions that year vs Spring Grove ties him for 3rd. Tim also saw time in the defensive backfield and was the kicker.

Tim attended Shippensburg University where he played 4 years of football as a QB and kicker. He was the Raiders captain both his junior and senior seasons. He led Ship to a 12-1 record in 1981 which is still the school's record for wins in a season. That season brought home a PSAC, ECAC, and Lambert Cup championship and took the Raiders all the way to the NCAA Division 2 semifinals. For his efforts in 1981, Tim was named the ECAC Player of the Year. His Ship records include the following: Career Passing Efficiency Completions (55.4%, SU record), Single Season Passing Efficiency Completion (59.9%, SU record), Threw TD pass in 14 straight games (SU record), 4,658 passing yards (SU 4th), 2,402 passing yards in single season (SU 6th), and an NCAA record 99 yard TD pass to Ed Noon in 1982. Tim was inducted into the Shippensburg Athletic Hall of Fame in 1996.

Tim has stayed in the college world after graduation as an Assistant Football coach and Head Baseball coach at Lebanon Valley (1986-1994), the Shippensburg University Executive Director for University Relations (1996-2015), and currently the Shippensburg University Coordinator for Academic Support Services for Student-Athletes.



Pete Brillhart – Starting in the 80's and finishing in the 90's (1989-1991), Pete Brillhart's football career at West York was played in the heart of the field as a fullback and inside line-backer.

On the offensive side of the ball Pete was a workhorse. Pete's senior year he was a big part of the school's 2nd 10-0 season and 1991 District championship. His 31 rushing attempts in the district title game vs Bermudian Springs ranks him 2nd in the school record books. His 4 TD's in the same game ties him for 3rd. Defensively, Pete totaled 119 total points his sophomore year and 111 his junior year. His senior campaign earned him all league honors at both positions and a 2nd team all-state defensive selection.

After college, Pete attended West Chester University playing football in 1992 and 1993. He is currently a Systems Engineer for Alorica. His family includes wife Heidi, daughter Peyton (13), son Ben (10), and daughter Sydney (5).





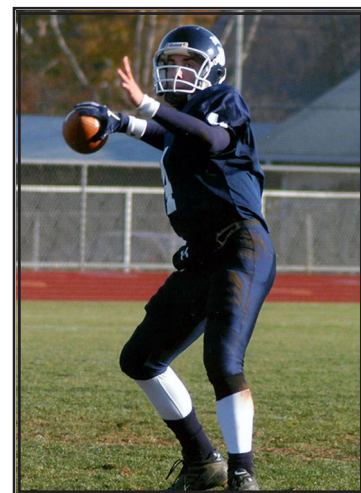
Chad Toomey – Chad Toomey was a standout Running Back and Linebacker for the Bulldogs from 1982-1984. His 59 solo tackles in 1984 ranks him 2nd in the West York Record book. That season also saw Chad rack up 166 defensive points to rank him 2nd on the team and 7th in school history. His coaches will tell you that “pound for pound”, Chad was one of the toughest players to ever come through the West York program. Chad has remained active in West York sports coaching football and wrestling for 30 years and is currently a member of the varsity football staff.

Chad works for Lehigh Cement as a Quality Control Tech. His family includes wife Michelle and sons Jerrin and Gavin. The Toomey family is blue and white through and through with all of them graduating from West York with the boys all playing football.

Joe “Spike” Bahn – Joe attended West York from 1981-1984 where he was the team manager for all 4 years. Spike has continued to manage and help out with all sports at West York for the last 33 years. Joe would like to thank everyone who has helped him over the years. He would especially like to thank trainers Eric and Megan as well as Hannah Scheivert and her family. He is very grateful for the people who have given him rides to and from the school. And a special thank you to all who have put up with him over the years!!!

Without his family, Spike would not be able to be here to do what he loves. His parents, his sister and brother-in-law, Kim and Tom Cox, and his nieces Abby and Ally. He is proud of the other inductees and happy to be going into the Hall of Fame with his good friend Chad Toomey.

Robert Estep – Robert Estep was the Bulldogs starting Quarterback for the 2005 and 2006 seasons. In 2006, Rob set school records for: Most Pass Attempts (234), Most Pass Completions (124), and Most Pass Yards (2082). He completed 17 passes in a game twice that season and had a school record 294 pass yards vs Susquehannock. His efforts in 2006 were rewarded with the YAIAA offensive Player of the Year. For his career, Robert threw for 3,396 yards and 22 TD's. A standout basketball player also, Rob's college career took him in that direction at Susquehanna University where he was a 1,000 point scorer. Rob furthered his schooling graduating from St. Louis University School of Law in 2015. He is currently an Assistant Attorney General for the State of Missouri. He lives in Jefferson City, Missouri with his newlywed bride Tristin.



Coach Rich Fry – Rich Fry coached as an assistant for the Bulldogs from 1994-2004. His responsibilities included both the offensive and defensive lines as well as coordinating the defense. Rich was part of 3 District playoff teams during his tenure at West York. Rich graduated from Dallastown high school. He attended Millersville University where he played 1 year of football before transferring to York College. Rich worked for Flinchbaugh Company before his untimely passing. He is survived by his wife Karen, son Josh and his wife Amanda (grandchildren Rhett Fry, Quinton Einsig, and Bryce Einsig), daughter Jess Kuntz and her husband Trevor (grandchildren Sydney and Charleigh). Rich's legacy continues on through his son Josh who is a teacher and varsity football coach at West York.



Coach Don Parr – Don Parr came to West York after being an integral part of founding the Spring Grove Midget Football Club and a brief stint at Kennard-Dale High School. He started his Bulldog coaching career as the head Junior High coach before moving up to the Varsity staff in 1997. As a member of the '97 and '98 staff, he was part of District qualifying teams.

Donnie graduated from Spring Grove High School and worked as a machinist at Caterpillar Tractor for 31 years before retiring in 1998. Donnie passed away after a courageous battle with cancer in 2012. He leaves his wife Ginny with whom he was married for 46 years. He is also survived by his daughter Lori Tyson and her husband Thomas, and son Chad and his wife Debbie. His grandchildren are Gabriel and Grace Tyson and Mackenzie Parr.
