## WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2025

**MARCUS SWEITZER** – A 1989 West York graduate, Marcus Sweitzer played 2 years of varsity football for the Bulldogs. In the 1987 season, Marcus played wide receiver before moving to quarterback his senior year. In that 1988 senior season, Marcus completed 50 passes for 852 yards and 9 TD's and he also rushed for 6 TD's. Marcus led the Bulldogs to the District 3 AA championship saving one of his best performances for the title game throwing for 160 yards, 2 TD's, and a huge 54 yard run to help clinch the final scoring drive. The post season saw Marcus named the YCIAA York Dispatch/Coaches Division 2 1st team QB. Marcus was also the Daily Record/York Dispatch Athlete of the week for his efforts vs Dover and the WSBA Radio 910 Player of the Game vs Spring Grove.

In addition to football, Marcus played 3 years of basketball for the Bulldogs.

Marcus attended Penn St. York and Penn St. Harrisburg majoring in Marketing. He has been an outside sales engineer for Penn-Air and has been with the company for 39 years.

Marcus has also been active in the Bulldog community as a coach. He started with youth football for the West York Boys Club for 9 years (2005-2013). He founded the West York Canine Lacrosse Club in 2006. For 17 years, Marcus coached boys and girls lacrosse at both the youth and high school levels (2005-2021).

Marcus and his family have the West York bloodline including his wife Stacey, daughters Sara, Ellie, Sydney, and son Trevor - all West York graduates - along with daughter-in-law Kirsten and grandson Reed.

**MATT GLENNON** – A 1989 West York graduate, Matt Glennon was a 3-year varsity player for the Blue and White. Matt was a tight end/defensive end and linebacker. Matt was a member of the 1988 District championship team which advanced to the first ever PIAA State football playoffs before bowing out in the semi-final round. He contributed with a big 25 yard TD catch in the District championship vs Delone. For the season, he ended up with 11 catches for just shy of 200 yards. Matt was named as a York Dispatch/Coaches Division 2 1st team Tight End.

Matt also played 3 years of basketball at West York.

Matt moved onto Dickinson College playing 4 years of football. He was a part of 4 Centennial Conference Championship teams and participated in 2 NCAA Playoff games and 1 ECAC Championship Game.

After college, Matt taught and coached at various places including Hayfield HS in Virginia, Central Dauphin HS, and Westmont Hilltop HS. Matt had a stint as head coach at York Tech. He is currently a teacher at York Tech and he is the defensive coordinator for the William Penn Bearcats.

Matt's family includes his wife Melanie and 3 children, Madelyn, Jonathon, and Patrick. His father Dr. Albert Glennon (former WY Superintendent), mother Barbara, siblings Colleen, Tom, Dave, Greg, and Alison.

**JASON WEBER** – A 1992 graduate, Jason was a 2-year varsity football player. He was best known for his position as quarterback but he was also a kicker. In his senior season, Jason led the high powered 1991 offense to over 3200 total yards. He completed 49 of 92 passes for 1006 yards and 12 TD's and he also rushed for 3 TD's. In the district semifinal vs Newport, Jason guided the offense to 449 yards of total offense in a 35-7 blowout victory. Jason was named to the York Dispatch/Coaches Division 2 team as QB of the first team offense. He was named 2nd team offense in the York Daily Record "Super 24" team.

Jason attended college and has been the owner of Longview Wealth Solutions and currently continues as a Financial Advisor.

Jason's family includes wife, Natalie and kids, Ashton, Carson, and Dylan.

**PHIL KERN** – A 1992 graduate, Phil played 2 years of varsity football for the Bulldogs as a tight end and defensive end. His senior season in 1991 included 13 receptions for 267 yards and 5 TD's. On defense, he had 9 solo tackles and 11 assists, 4.5 sacks, 4 blocked passes and 1 blocked kick. Phil provided playoff memories with a big catch and run to open the playoffs against Newport and contributed with 2 sacks leading the 'Dogs in the district championship game. He was named to the York Dispatch/Coaches All-County Team as a Division II 1st team defensive end and 2nd team tight end. He was the Daily Record Super 24 2nd team tight end. He was a scholarship recipient from the Sports Medicine Foundation and York County Quarterback Club.

Phil also played on the basketball team throughout his high school years.

Phil attended Ursinus College graduating in 1996 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology with a minor in Chemistry. He attended Johns Hopkins University from 1998-2000 and graduated with a master's degree in biotechnology. While at Ursinus, Phil played 3 years of football.

Phil has been with Pfizer pharmaceuticals for 29 years in various roles ensuring the quality of products that are used by patients around the globe.

**LOGAN STOVER** – A 2015 graduate, Logan played 3 years of varsity football. He was the center on the offensive line and played defensive line. Logan was 2-time first team All YAIIA center, 2014 captain, 2012 and 2014 Division 2 champion, leader of an offensive line that helped produce: 495 yards/game, 43.1 points/game, 333 rush yards/game and an average victory margin of 28 points (43-15).

Logan played 4 years of baseball for the Bulldogs where he was a 2-time State Champion 2012 and 2013, a 3-time County Champion, and a 2-time YAIIA First Team First Baseman.

Logan attended Lebanon Valley College graduating in 2019. He was a 2 sport college athlete playing football and baseball for 3 years. He was a 3 time MAC Academic Honor Roll in both sports. He was a 2 year starter at left guard. He majored in Political Science with minors in Economics and Law.

Logan is currently Director of Policy and Legislative Affairs for the PA State Association of Boroughs. He has also been a lobbyist for the PA Bar Association.

Logan's family includes his parents, Lorie and Dan, and girlfriend, Hannah Trimmer.
