WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2024

TONY DESEMBERG – A 1977 West York graduate, Tony Desenberg has lived football his entire life. Tony played for the Blue and White before starting a long coaching career that included working with some of York County's legendary head coaches.

Tony attended WY from 1974-1977 playing 3 years for the Bulldog football team. On offense, "TD" was a tackle and on defense was an end. In his senior season, Tony was named All County Honorable Mention.

Tony also ran track for 3 years and played basketball for 1. He was part of the 2 mile relay team that won a county title his junior year and the mile relay team that captured the county title his senior season. That mile relay team also went on to finish 6th in the district meet.

Tony started his coaching career immediately out of high school helping the West York Boys Club from 1977-1980. He became a part of the high school staff in 1981 and remained on the Bulldog staff for 13 years through 1995. TD was part of numerous division titles and 2 district championship teams while on the Bulldog staff. Tony moved over to Central for 2 stints totaling 18 years, 1995-1999 and 2003-2015. In between there was a stop at Biglerville 2000-2002. Tony finished his coaching career at York High for 7 seasons 2016-2022.

Now happily retired, Tony's family includes wife Sandy, mother Yvonne Crone, sons Shaun, Adam, and Ian, daughter Ashley, stepson Nate, stepdaughter Kristi, and 9 grandchildren

"As a young youth football player, I would walk by the high school field imagining the day I could play on that field. In my eyes, it was sacred ground. Football became my life playing and coaching for 43 years. Every year I have coached, my huddle grew bigger and bigger.

Not only was he my idol when he played for the Bulldogs, but he was also a great coaching mentor. CHRIS GAILEY – Chris Gailey attended West York from 2004-2007. He played 3 years of varsity football patrolling the offensive and defensive lines as a tackle. He was named to the All County team on both offense and defense his junior and senior seasons. After his senior season, Chris was named to the North/South All Star Game. Chris was a 3 year 3 sport athlete at West York also participating in wrestling and track & field.

Chris went on to Millersville University where he played football for 4 years before graduating in 2012. He was a 3 year varsity letterman for the Marauders.

Chris is currently an Employee Experience Supervisor at Comcast Corporation. His family includes his wife Alyssa and son Wyatt.

BRETT CAMPBELL – Brett is a 2011 graduate of WY playing 3 years of varsity football. He also participated in lacrosse and basketball.

Brett's senior season in 2010 was one for the record books. His school records for a game include: 10 catches vs Dallastown ties for 2nd • 7 catches vs Dover and Northeastern ties for 5th 159 yards vs New Oxford ties for 3rd • 4 TD's vs Central ties for 3rd • 101 Interception return for a TD For the 10 game regular season: 51 catches ties for 3rd • 947 receiving yards ranks him #1.

Brett continued his great play in the district playoffs with 5 catches vs Cocalico which ties him for 1st in a playoff game. His 2010 season was capped off with numerous awards:

Upon graduation, Brett joined Symetra in the corporate home office in Bellevue, WA. He is currently regional Vice President for Symetra residing in Boise, Idaho with his wife Kristen

ZACK SMITH – A 2013 graduate, Zack was a 2 year player for the ‘Dogs. Zack shined as a wide receiver and defensive back. Zack’s name is dotted all over the WY record books for receiving. He is 2nd in a 10 game regular season with 53 catches in 2012. Add in 11 catches in the playoffs to bring his total to 64 which is the most catches in a season. His 861 yards during the regular season in 2012 ranks 3rd. He is T2 Most Receptions in a Game with 10 vs York High and T4 with 8 vs Spring Grove both in 2012. His 156 receiving yards vs York High in 2012 ties him for 5th best. The 2012 playoffs were also a shining moment for Zack. He had 5 catches vs Northeastern which ties him for first for most catches in a playoff game and his 173 yards in that game is the most in a playoff game. His 2 year totals were 89 catches for 1800 yards and 26 TD’s. He had multiple selections as a WR/DB for All County honors, 1st team All State WR, 1st team All Eastern PA Big School Team WR, and the York County 2012 Player of the Year.

As a Bulldog, he also played 3 other sports: Wrestling (3 years), Baseball (2 years), Track (2 years). Zack attended Bloomsburg University for 2 years playing football both years. Zack is currently the Pennsylvania Manager for Robinhood Roofing and also is on the WY football staff.

“I would like to thank my parents for the countless rides to and from sports growing up! I would like to thank my family for the constant support you guys gave me. I would also like to thank all of my teachers for helping me to stay on top of things in school and helping when I needed it. I would like to thank all of my coaches for trusting me to even play on Friday nights because without that none of this would even be happening. And finally, a big thanks to the 2012 offensive line because without the big boys up front this honor would not be possible!” - Zack

JIM SNELBAKER – Before becoming part of the Bulldog family, Jim graduated from Dover in 1992. He played 3 years of football for the Eagles at offensive guard and defensive end. He was named All County first team defensive end in 1991. He was named to the War of the Roses All Star team in 1991. Jim was named the Dover scholar athlete in 1991. Jim spent his college days at Lebanon Valley where he lettered all 4 years in football. He also lettered 3 years in outdoor track and field and 1 year with the indoor track team. He was named a 4 time MAC All Academic team. He won the school’s Scott Wallace Memorial Award in 1996 and was named a national scholar athlete the same year.

After teaching 1 year at Palmyra, Jim moved to West York where he has spent the past 27 years teaching 8th grade social studies.

He started his coaching career in 1996 at Palmyra Middle School. Upon arrival at WY, he joined the WY Middle School staff under head coach Doug Crawford. From 1997-2003, the middle school had a combined record of 44-10 including 3 division championships. Jim moved to the high school varsity staff under head coach Terry Bupp and head coach Ron Miller from 2004-2014. During that time, the teams had a record of 92-39, 7 division championships, qualified for districts 8 times including runner up one time and a district championship in 2008. His latest coaching position was back at his alma mater Dover under his brother Wayne (who also spent time on the WY sidelines). The brothers hooked up from 2015-2023 with a record of 40-49 and qualified for district play 2 times.

“My most memorable experiences were winning the district championship in 2008, the numerous practices (with donuts) on Thanksgiving morning, the lifetime friendships created with my fellow coaches and players, and the opportunity to coach and coach with several of my family members.

I would like to thank the West York Football Hall of Fame committee for this great honor. I’d also like to thank the West York community, fans, coaches, and players for the awesome memories and accomplishments we achieved together. I’m honored to have been a part of positively influencing so many student-athletes over my 28 year span as a coach. And finally, thank you to my wife Steph, my kids Carson and Kylie, my Mom and Dad and Father-in-Law, as well as many other family members for their unconditional support and sacrifices to let me pursue my passion.” - Jim

JEREMY JONES – Hailing from the northern part of PA, Jeremy graduated from Wyalusing high school in 1997 and East Stroudsburg University in 2002.

Jeremy has had a coaching career that has included time both as an assistant and head coach. He started in 2002 as a West York assistant running through 2012. From 2006-2012 the Bulldogs qualified for districts. From 2008-2012, the Bulldog offense averaged 34.5 pts/game with Jeremy as the offensive coordinator. In 2008 the ‘Dogs were District Champs and State semi-finalists with the 6th highest scoring offense in PA history. The 2012 team also advanced to the district finals.

Jeremy moved to York Suburban where he took over the top spot for the Trojans for 2 seasons (2013 and 2014). He moved back to WY as the Bulldogs head coach from 2015-2018. In his final season, the ‘Dogs qualified for the class AAAA district playoffs. Jeremy went on to Susquehannock as offensive coordinator for one season before returning to WY last season to join Coach Miller’s staff and remains in that position this season.

Jeremy is proud of the following stats:

- In 13 of 15 years, his QB’s were recognized as top 3 in Division 2
 - 3 of those QB’s were All State honorable mention
 - 3 threw for over 2000 yards
 - 6 other All State players
 - 4 Division I college graduates
- Jeremy currently teaches in the West York elementary schools. His family includes wife Carrie and son Calvin.
