

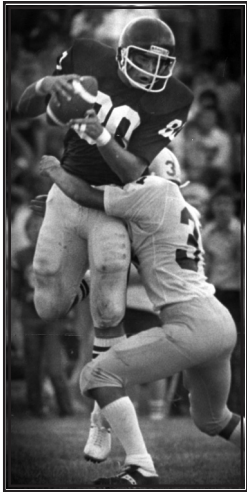
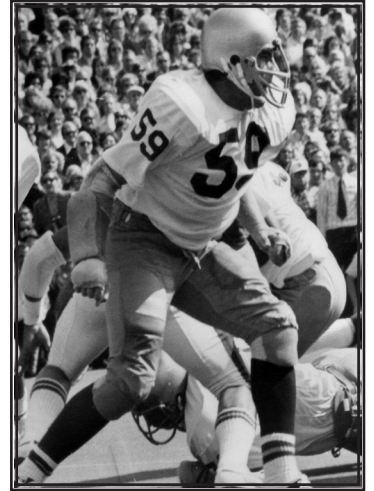


WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2018

MARK BRENNEMAN — Attending West York from 1966-1970, Mark Brenneman played varsity football for 3 years. His presence in the interior line at offensive center and defensive tackle, helped the Bulldogs to 2 county titles. After his senior season, Mark was an Associated Press All State selection, Big 33 team member & captain, and an honorable mention Scholastic Coaches magazine high school All American.

Upon graduation, Mark traveled to South Bend to attend Notre Dame. He played 4 years for the Fighting Irish starting at center in 1973 and 1974. He was a member of the '73 NCAA Division I National Champions. In 1974, he was a COSIDA 2nd team Academic All American and an honorable mention AP All American. His Notre Dame team awards include the John P. McMullan Award (best exemplifies student athlete) and the Byron V. Kanaley Award (Notre Dame faculty award for student and leader of men).

Mark is currently a sales representative for Boston Scientific Corporation. He resides in Columbus, Ohio with his wife Alayne and son Seth.



THOM HECKARD — A 1980 graduate, Thom Heckard was a 3 sport standout for the Bulldogs in the late 70's. He played 3 years of varsity football spending time at defensive end, tight end, and center. He was named as an All County selection in both his junior and senior years. His senior season also netted him a Super 22 Most Outstanding Lineman award and a nomination to the Big 33 squad.

Thom moved on to Brown University from 1980-1984 where he continued as a 2 sport athlete. He was a 3 year starter on the football team as an outside linebacker. He also was a 3 year starter for the baseball team and was signed by the New York Yankees in 1984.

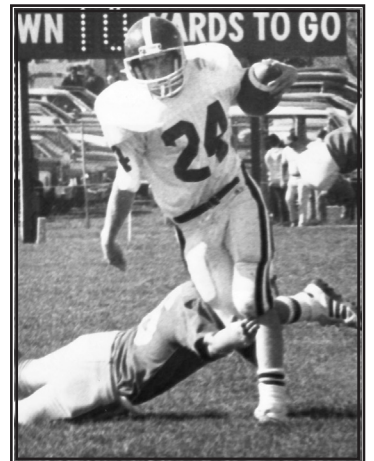

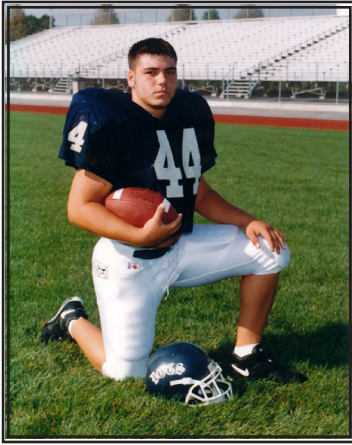
TROY KETTERMAN — Attending West York in the early 80's (1982-86), Troy Ketterman spent 3 years on the varsity football team. He showcased his offensive skills as both a running back and receiver while spending time on the defensive side of the ball at safety.

Troy garnered All County honors all 3 seasons including a Player of the Year award in 1985. He was also the Channel 27 Player of the Year and the YAIAA scoring champ in 1985.

"Ket" attended West Chester University from 1986-1988 playing 1 year of football. He finished his college education at York College and played 2 years of baseball for the Spartans.

Troy is currently employed by UPS as a driver. His family includes wife Adrienne and son Trent (on this year's team). Mom Jean, Dad Michael, sister Shelly Narber, and brothers Mike Ketterman and Steve Gilbert (both former Bulldog players).





ATHAN MARGETAS — Athan attended West York from 1995-1998 playing 3 years of varsity football. His positions included Inside Linebacker and Tight End.

Athan's senior year at linebacker was arguably one of the better individual performances on that side of that ball. His 148 defensive points that year led the team and propelled him to the Division II Player of the Year as well as the defensive Player of the Year.

Athan continued his football career at Bloomsburg University and Western Maryland College playing linebacker. In 2001 he was named a 1st team All Centennial Conference pick. He spent time briefly with the semi-pro Central Penn Piranha.

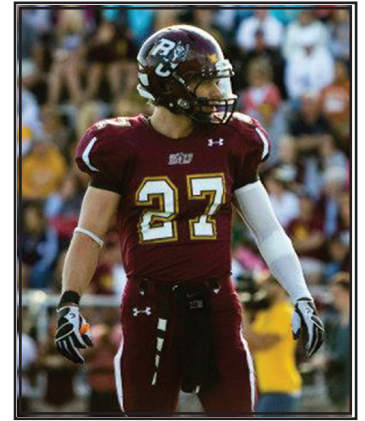
Athan currently is the owner of The Vault Pizza and Deli starting with one location in 2013 and expanding to a 2nd location in Shiloh in 2015. The restaurant allows Athan to rekindle the experiences he has had in the past growing up and to continue to be involved and support the place that he grew up and made him into the person he is today.

DANIAL HAVERSTOCK — Dan attended West York from 2004-2008. He was a 3 year varsity football player using his skills at quarterback, receiver, safety and defensive back. In his senior year as a QB he rushed for 15 TD's and passed for 15 TD's as well as throwing for over 1000 yards. From his secondary spot, Dan collected 11 career interceptions. For his efforts, he was an All County pick both his junior and senior years as well as being named Co-Player of the Year in 2007.

"Havie" went on to an outstanding career at Bloomsburg University spending his time patrolling the defensive backfield. In his senior year he was rewarded with an All Region selection.

Dan is currently the Assistant Dean of Students at Bloomsburg. His family includes girlfriend Codi, parents David and Sue, brother Dave and sister-in-law Angelica along with grandparents Ron and Joan King.



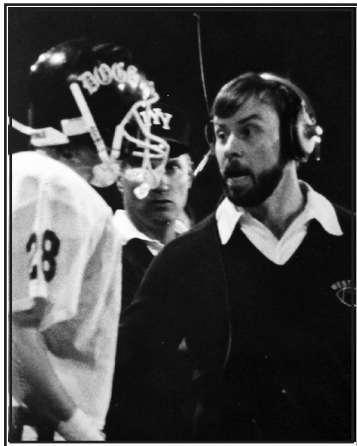
COACH STEVE COTTON — A 1970 graduate of East Brunswick HS in New Jersey Steve lettered in football as a fullback and linebacker. He was an All County pick as a fullback in 1969.

Steve moved on to Millersville University where he played football for 4 years. After a year on the freshman team, Steve's 2nd season saw him spend time recovering from surgeries to both his shoulders. His recovery led to him playing and receiving letters in both his junior and senior years.

Steve came to West York as an elementary teacher in the fall of '74 and remained there until 1990. He finished his education career as an administrator for the Spring Grove school district from 1990-2007.

Coach Cotton spent 20 years on the sidelines. From 1974-76 he was a junior high assistant under Don Gable. In '77, Steve moved to head junior high coach. In 1978, Steve moved up to a varsity assistant first with Marty Horner and then with Terry Bupp. Steve "retired" after the 1988 season only to come back and spend 2 stints as a volunteer first in 1991 and then from 1997-2000. An astute student of the game, Coach Cotton used his knowledge to help guide the Bulldogs to 2 district championships in 1988 and 1991 and a silver medal in 1997.

Steve's family includes wife Cherlane, daughter Amanda and son Matt who is married to Erin. The Cotton's have 5 grandchildren. All the kids and grand kids have or are attending West York schools.



KARL MUNSCHER — This year, the West York Football Booster Club is proud to induct Karl Munsch into the Hall of Fame. "Munsch" has assumed many roles for the Bulldog football program - player, coach, and founder of the football Hall of Fame. He attended West York graduating in 1987. He played 3 years of football as a guard and inside linebacker. After graduation, Karl joined the US Army (1987-1991) serving in the infantry during the Persian Gulf War.

"Munsch" came back to coach at West York from 1991-2015. He started as a junior high assistant under Don Parr before moving up to the varsity level under both Terry Bupp and Ron Miller. He was part of 8 Division champions and the 2008 District champs. Karl also was the President of the York/Adams football coaches association for 5 years. In 2011, the PA State Football Coaches Association recognized him for 20 years of service.

Karl is currently employed by River Rock Academy as a Behavioral Counselor since June 2006. Karl would like to thank the Bulldog community, the Booster Club, the administration and of course, the coaches and players for all their support.
