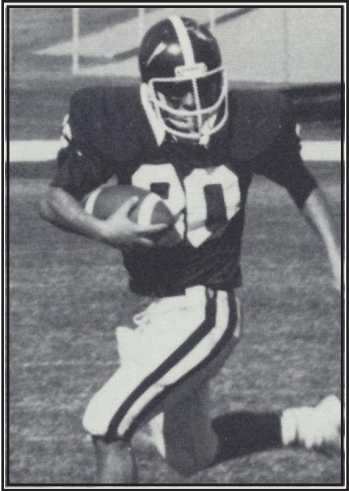
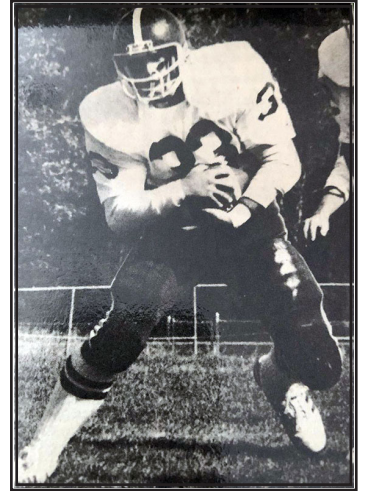




WEST YORK FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME - THE CLASS OF 2021

DAVE HECKARD– Dave Heckard was a 4 year starter for the Bulldogs from 1979-1982 becoming the first freshman to play varsity football at WY. Dave played a variety of offensive positions including fullback, tailback, wingback, and quarterback (2 games). On defense, Heckard played tackle and linebacker. He was named to the All County team 3 times after getting honorable mention his freshman year. Dave attended Gettysburg College graduating in 1987. He was a 4 year varsity letter winner and his senior year led the team in tackles. In 1987 he was a first team All-ECAC linebacker. Dave currently is the Vice President of Healthcare Research and Analytics in Cranbury, New Jersey. He resides in North Wales, PA with his wife Cindy and 4 children: Seamus, Maeve, Paddy, and Finn.



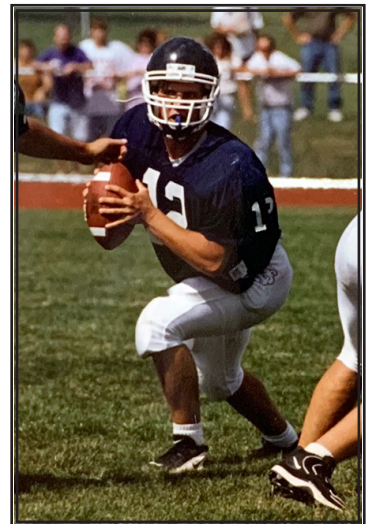
MARK PLYMIRE– Mark Plymire played 3 years of varsity football for the Bulldogs from 1981 through 1983. He was a middle linebacker and fullback. Mark is tied for 2nd in the WY record book with 8 other players recording 11 assisted tackles vs Red Lion in 1983. At the conclusion of the 1983 season, Mark was named the YCIAA Defensive Player of the Year. After West York, Plymire attended Carnegie Mellon from 1984-86. He played 1 year of football. Mark has been employed by Kindig Plumbing and Heating since 1986. In 1994, Mark became the owner of the business, a position he still holds today. Mark has been married to his wife Leah for 33 years. They have 3 children: Aaron, Gabriel, and Jonah along with granddaughters Hattie, Eloise, and Melanie.

JAY STINE– Jay Stine played varsity football for the Bulldogs from 1995-1998. He was the quarterback on offense while playing OLB/DE on defense. Jay was a 4 year varsity letter winner. He played on 2 division championship teams and also the 1997 District 3 Class AA Silver Medal team. In 1998, Jay was the York County Division 2 1st team QB and a Super 24 Honorable Mention. To cap off his stellar high school career, Jay was the starting QB in the 1998 War of the Roses All-Star game.

Stine attended Western Maryland college (currently McDaniel College) graduating in 2003. He played football from 1999-2001 and was part of 3 Division 3 Centennial Conference Championship teams.

Jay has worked for Lockheed Martin and Ernst & Young. He currently is the Director of Government Compliance at Northrup Grumman. He is an assistant coach of the Mt. Airy Pony football team.

Jay is married to his wife Erin. They have 2 sons Austin (10) and Connor (7). Jay's parents Rick and Cheri have been longtime supporters of West York sports.





NATE JACOBS – Graduating in 2009, Nate Jacobs was a 3 year varsity player for the Bulldogs. He was on the offensive side of the ball as a wide receiver. Nate was part of 2 YAIAA Division 2 championships and one runner-up. He was part of the 2008 District championship team.

In 2006, Nate had 9 catches with 3 of them being TD's. In 2007, he jumped to 33 catches for the season tallying 703 yards with 10 TD's. He was named to the YAIAA Division 2 All-Star team. In his senior year of 2008, Nate caught 38 passes for 874 yards and 11 TD's and returned 1 punt for a TD. He was once again named to the YAIAA Division 2 All-Star team. Nate was named to the All PFN (Pennsylvania Football News) Team as a Class AAA Honorable Mention Wide Receiver all 3 seasons.

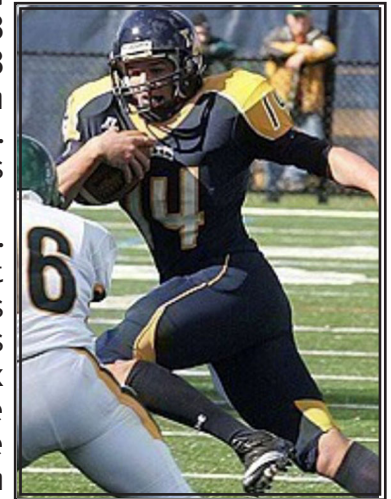
Nate attended Indiana University of PA from 2009-2013 playing football 2009 and 2010.

He is currently employed at Apple Subaru since 2016. His family members include Sherry (Mom), Charles (Dad) and Aaron (Brother).

ALEX GEORGE – A 3 year varsity player for the Bulldogs, Alex graduated in 2010. As a QB, Alex was part of Bulldog teams that had a combined 34-6 record including 17-1 in league play. Alex had 16 pass completions vs Dallastown in 2008 which ties him for 3rd in the record books and 14 vs Susquehannock also in 2008 tying him for 5th. He was part of teams that won a the District 3 championship in 2008, 3 Division 2 titles, and was a combined 6-3 in District playoffs over 3 years. Over 3 years, Alex enjoyed the home lights as his teams went 20-1 at home. He was a 2 time YAIAA All-Star.

Alex went on to a successful college career at Wilkes University from 2010-2014. Had his first collegiate action blocking a punt against Hobart University in his first college game. Had first action at QB leading Wilkes to a 4th quarter comeback vs Lebanon Valley. Trailing 28-6, Wilkes won 35-28 in OT after Alex passed for 2 TD's and ran for 2 more. Was lucky enough to be part of teams that got Coach Sheptock both his 100th win and also was able to score 5 TD's in a winning effort that made coach the winningest coach in school history. Was multiple conference player of the week winner and honorable mention all conference at both QB and TE. He won the Mayors Cup MVP. Received academic all conference team twice and also made Deans List 4 times while studying business.

Alex has worked for Enterprise and currently is a Project Manager for NVR overseeing building of new home communities. He is married to wife Megan and they have 2 boys Austin and Brady. They reside in Brunswick, Maryland.



JERRIN TOOMEY – Jerrin played varsity football for the 'Dogs from 2009-2011. He was a wide receiver and free safety. Jerrin was part of Bulldog teams that had a combined record of 29-8 and won 3 YAIAA Division 2 titles. Jerrin's 16 solo tackles in 2011 vs Dover is the most by any player in WY history. Jerrin also had 2 interceptions in a game twice, 2010 vs Susquehannock and 2011 vs South Western. In 2011, Jerrin was named the YAIAA Division 2 Player of the Year.

Jerrin attended Bloomsburg University playing for the Huskies from 2012-2016. He was a 3 year starter at safety. He played on the PSAC championship team in 2013. In 2014, he won the PSAC Scholar Athlete award which went to the player with the highest GPA in the the conference championship game. His 2014 team made it to the NCAA Quarterfinals. His most memorable college game was when #8 Bloom beat undefeated #7 West Chester 41-10 with his defense forcing 6 turnovers including Jerrin's 3 interceptions.

Jerrin is currently as assistant football coach at York Suburban. He is a financial advisor at SC&H Financial Advisors. His parents are Chad and Michelle and he has a younger brother Gavin who also played WY football 2013-2016. He is married to Jocelyn and they live in West York with their 2 dogs Harper and Witten.
